

The last will and testament of Richard Campkin PROB 11/193

In the name of God Amen I Richard Campkin of Pyrton in the countie of Hertford sick of body but perfect remembrance doe ordaine this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following

Imprimis I bequeath my soule into the hands of allmightie God and my bodie to the ground and for my worldly goods I bequeath as followeth

Imprimis I bequeath my house and orchard and close being one half acre in the Occupation of George Man unto my beloved wife Joane for and during the Terme of her natural life and after her decease I bequeath it the said house with the appurtenances unto my sonne Thomas Camkin and to the heyres of his bodie forever

Item I give unto my foure daughters the sume of twentie pounds a peece to be payed unto them iin two severall portions that is tenn pounds a peece att their severall ages of eighteene yeares and the other tenn pounds within one month after the decease of my wife.

Item I give under my three sonnes to each of them twentie shillings

Item I give under the poore of Pyrton tenn shillings

Item I give under our Minister tenn shillings

All the rest of my goods moveable and chattles I give unto my beloved wife Joane whome I ordaine executrix of this my last will and testament. In witness I have sett my hand and seale this twentie and six day of September in the yeare of our lord God one thousand sixe hundred fortie three Richard Campkin
